e.g. Oak (T3) - fell because of excessive shading and low amenity value. Replant with one standard ash in same position.

Three large lime trees all subject of a similar request in 2015 (2015/26865) & 2018 (2018/31917). To remove them completely, as would all neighbours (6 to 9), this is due to constant shredding of leaves/branches, leaving a thick sticky sap on garden furniture and patio which is currently cleaned on a daily basis, roof tops, cars (cleaned on 29th June covered in sap 30th June photo evidence can be provided), house windows (cleaned 29th, covered in sap 30th June photo evidence can be provided) and pets (dog covered in sap, has led to expensive grooming fees). Tree roots growing towards the house & garage structure. Unable to hang washing out to dry due to sap and bird droppings. They are preventing the growth of plants & lawn in the garden due to lack of sun or any light (photo evidence can be provided). We get approximately 5 hours of sunlight in the back garden from 11am onwards and that does not reach all of the garden. Lack of sun or any light into the kitchen & bedrooms - very gloomy outlook! The recent high winds has also broken branches of 7 & 8 which are hanging precariously at a height we cannot reach. We know that the houses behind on Riversdale would not complain if they were to be removed as they are also suffering with the leaves and sap. Under the current climate when we are in lockdown you can imagine how this is becoming really frustrating and increasing anxiety. Happy to replace with much smaller trees if required
